Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

The North-West University accepts the principle underlying outcomes-based, source-based and lifelong learning, in which considerations of articulation and mobility play a significant role, and subscribes to the view of recognition of prior learning.

Whether acquired by formal education curricula at this or another institution or informally (by experience) is an indispensable element in deciding on admission to and awarding credits in an explicitly selected teaching-learning programme of the North-West University.

Students will qualify for RPL in accordance with the Rules and Procedures of the University and the Faculty of Humanities. Each RPL application will be evaluated on its own merits. RPL procedures to be followed are set out in the University's procedural guidelines.

Minimum Admission Requirements

Matric obtained before 2008

- Students should have a **M-score of 13**
- A minimum achievement at **Level 2 (HG) (40-49%) in language of learning**
- Senior Certificate with University exemption endorsement or "**M**" **Aggregate**.

Matric obtained after 2008

- Prospective students should have an **APS score of 25**
- A minimum achievement at **level 4 (50-59%) in the language of learning**.
- **National Senior Certificate (Grade 12) with University Exemption endorsement**.
