

NWU Preparatory Programme (UnivPrep) 2018 Information Brochure

1. INTRODUCTION

The NWU Preparatory Programme offers a unique opportunity to prospective students who do not meet the minimum admission requirements for admission to formal degree/diploma study at the NWU and aims to lay a foundation for prospective students in preparation for the following formal NWU programmes:

- Bachelor of Commerce (BCom) Degree
- Bachelor of Science (BSc Information Technology) Degree
- Bachelor of Theology (BTh) Degree
- Bachelor of Education (BEd) Degree
- Bachelor of Arts (BA) Degree in Public Governance (with Policing Practice)
- Diploma in Grade R Teaching

2. DURATION

The duration of the programme is **one year** and it comprises academic modules as well as academic development modules.

3. ADMISSION TO FORMAL DEGREE STUDY AND RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

- Upon successful completion of the programme (PASSING ALL MODULES with 50%), prospective students may **APPLY for recognition of prior learning and admission** to one of the above-mentioned NWU qualifications.
- Admission to formal degree/diploma study and granting of recognition of prior learning is not an automatic
 process and will be based on faculty discretionary decision and the academic performance of the candidate will
 be taken into consideration.
- To qualify for admission to formal degree/diploma study after successful completion of the UnivPrep programme, participants who have not met the minimum requirements for admission to Bachelor study (for degree admission) or Diploma study (for admission to the Grade R Diploma) in the National Senior Certificate examination, will also be required to write and pass the **NWU Admission test**.

4. METHOD OF DELIVERY

- The Open Distance Learning instructional model makes provision for **countrywide contact sessions** by means of interactive whiteboards at various learning support centres.
- Lecturers responsible for the different modules teach in Potchefstroom, Mafikeng or Vanderbijlpark while the lectures are being broadcasted live to the different learning support centres.
- UnivPrep participants can interrupt lecturers to ask questions or provide answers to questions as the whiteboard technology allows for immediate interaction between participants and lecturers. Technicians at the learning support centres provide participants with assistance in this regard.
- UnivPrep participants attend contact sessions on certain weekdays and weekends with an average of 4-8 sessions per module, per semester, depending on the UnivPrep specialisation. It is a proven fact that those participants who attend contact sessions regularly have a higher success rate than those who do not.
- UnivPrep participants are expected to do **independent self-study** to ensure that they are thoroughly prepared when attending contact sessions.

5. EXAMINATIONS

Examinations are conducted at various exam centres nationwide, with NWU staff setting the examination papers and assessing answer scripts.

6. UODL LEARNING SUPPORT CENTRES

- The programme is presented at the three **North-West University campuses** in Potchefstroom, Mafikeng and Vanderbijlpark as well as other **UODL learning support centres**.
- Centres will be determined by the clustering of registered participants and will be confirmed by the UODL upon final registration, **depending on student numbers per centre.**
- Instead of attending contact sessions at a learning support centre, UnivPrep participants may also opt to join the
 live broadcasts of lectures, in the comfort of their own homes, by making use of a personal computer/laptop
 and internet connection. The Unit for Open Distance Learning will provide UnivPrep participants with technical
 support and the necessary software (free of charge) to enable them to connect to the broadcasts of the lectures.
- The learning support centres listed below were functional at the time of compiling this brochure. Learning support centres as indicated in this brochure may vary from year to year according to the number of enrolled participants. Note: Not all listed centres will be functional to present UnivPrep programmes. Only those centres with sufficient enrolments will be selected.

7. INTERNET AND TECHNOLOGY

- **Internet and Technology** are used extensively in delivering distance education programmes and it is therefore of utmost importance that UnivPrep participants have access to the **Internet** by means of a **computer or laptop**.
- UnivPrep participants have to access study material and programme related information, submit assignments, complete assessments, interact with lecturers and other participants through live chats and keep track of important events and due dates by means of eFundi which is the online collaboration and learning management system (LMS) of the NWU.
- Communication between the NWU and UnivPrep participants occurs extensively through electronic communication media such as eFundi (LMS), SMS's (mobile phones) and social media.
- All **lectures** are recorded and saved on the Internet and can be viewed afterwards by participants as frequently as required.
- It is **COMPULSORY**, and the responsibility of the student to obtain the necessary technology such as a computer and mobile phone that meet the minimum specifications of the NWU namely: Wi-Fi enabled, Windows-, Android-or Apple operating system, 3G enabled (preferably) and 32 Gig (preferably).

8. COST

The total course fee for the UnivPrep programme is R9 500.00 per annum. The fee includes registration and study material.

9. LANGUAGE MEDIUM

All UnivPrep programmes are only available in **English** as a medium of instruction.

10. STUDENT SUPPORT

- UnivPrep participants receive study material, including comprehensive study guides, textbooks, readers and Web access to programme related academic and content information.
 - NOTE: Study material for some modules are only available online (on eFundi).
- All lectures are recorded and saved on the Internet to be viewed by UnivPrep participants as frequently as required.
- WiFi is available at the three NWU campuses as well as the learner support centres.
- Lecturers are keen to provide support and assistance and participants are encouraged to make contact with lecturers by means of telephone, e-mail or personal appointments.

11. APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION IN 2018

PLEASE NOTE: Due to capacity limitations, the University reserves the right to select candidates for admission to the various UnivPrep programmes. This implies that applicants who comply with the minimum academic requirements may not necessarily be admitted to the programme.

- Registration as a UnivPrep participant takes place at a later stage, and only after the prescribed enrolment fee has been paid (see programme information).
- An applicant who is not a SA citizen and who does not have a permanent residence permit, must obtain a study permit, issued by the National Department of Home Affairs of the RSA.

14. UNIVPREP PROGRAMME INFORMATION

14.1 UnivPrep Specialisation: Bachelor of Commerce (BCom) with Economics

PLEASE NOTE: The Bachelor of Commerce (BCom) **Degree** is currently not being offered by the NWU by means of distance education. After successful completion of the BCom UnivPrep programme, prospective students wishing to enrol for a BCom Degree, have to enrol for **full-time** studies at one of the NWU campuses.

Minimum Admission Requirements

- National Senior Certificate with university admission to Diploma- or Bachelor's degree study, or equivalent qualification.
- Admission Points Score (APS) of 4 points below normal admission (APS score of 24) to BCom studies, otherwise
 admission per Senate Discretionary rule. This implies that a minimum APS score of 20 will be considered for
 admission to the UnivPrep BCom programme.
- Minimum Maths Literacy score of 65% or Mathematics passed (30%) at Grade 12 level or equivalent qualification.
- Specific Requirements
 - Basic Computer Literacy
 - Personal access to Internet by means of a computer or laptop
 - It is **COMPULSORY**, and the responsibility of the student to obtain the necessary technology such as a computer and mobile phone that meet the minimum specifications of the NWU namely: Wi-Fi enabled, Windows-, Android- or Apple operating system, 3G enabled (preferably) and 32 Gig (preferably).

NB: Applicants who are accepted for the UnivPrep BCom Programme and who were enrolled in Mathematical Literacy in Grade 12, are STRONGLY ADVISED to take extra Maths classes for additional support.

14.2 UnivPrep Specialisation: Bachelor of Commerce (BCom) with Information Technology

PLEASE NOTE:

- Participants who completed the BCom with IT Programme successfully (passed all modules) may apply for admission to the BSc Degree in Information Technology.
- The Bachelor of Science (BSc) Degree in Information Technology is currently not being offered by the NWU by means of distance education. After successful completion of the BCom with IT UnivPrep programme, prospective students wishing to enrol for a BSc Degree in Information Technology, have to enrol for **full-time** studies at one of the NWU campuses where the degree is offered.

Minimum Admission Requirements

- National Senior Certificate with university admission to Diploma- or Bachelor's degree study, or equivalent qualification.
- Admission Points Score (APS) of 3 points below normal admission (APS score of 26) to BSc study, otherwise
 admission per Senate Discretionary rule. This implies that a minimum APS score of 23 will be considered for
 admission to the UnivPrep BCom with IT programme.
- Minimum Mathematics score of 35% at grade 12 level OR Mathematics Literacy score of 70% at grade 12 level or equivalent qualification.
- Specific Requirements: COMPULSORY!
 - Basic Computer Literacy
 - Personal access to a computer or laptop with a Microsoft Windows 7, 8 or 10 operating system, including access to the Internet from the computer or laptop.
 - Microsoft Office 2016 or Office 365. Registered UnivPrep participants will be provided with the Office 365 ProPlus package which is included in the programme fee.
 - It is COMPULSORY, and the responsibility of the UnivPrep participant to obtain the necessary technology such as a computer and mobile phone that meet the minimum specifications of the NWU namely: Wi-Fi enabled, Windows-, Android- or Apple operating system, 3G enabled (preferably) and 32 Gig (preferably).

 - **NB**: Applicants who are accepted for the UnivPrep BCom IT Programme and who were enrolled in Mathematical Literacy in Grade 12, are strongly advised to take extra Maths classes for additional support.

14.3 <u>UnivPrep Specialisation: Bachelor of Theology (BTh)</u>

PLEASE NOTE: The Bachelor of Theology (BTh) **Degree** is offered by means of distance education and after successful completion of the UnivPrep programme, prospective students will be able to enrol for the BTh degree by means of distance education.

Minimum Admission Requirements

- National Senior Certificate with university admission to Diploma- or Bachelor's degree study, or equivalent qualification.
- Admission Points Score (APS) of 4 points below normal admission (APS score of 24) to BTh studies, otherwise
 admission per Senate Discretionary rule. This implies that a minimum APS score of 20 will be considered for
 admission to the UnivPrep BTh programme.
- Specific Requirements
 - Basic Computer Literacy
 - Personal access to Internet by means of a computer or laptop
 - It is **COMPULSORY**, and the responsibility of the student to obtain the necessary technology such as a computer and mobile phone that meet the minimum specifications of the NWU namely: Wi-Fi enabled, Windows-, Android- or Apple operating system, 3G enabled (preferably) and 32 Gig (preferably).

14.4 <u>UnivPrep Specialisation: Bachelor of Arts in Public Governance (with Policing Practice)</u>

PLEASE NOTE: The Bachelor of Arts **Degree** in Public Governance (with Policing Practice) is currently not being offered by the NWU as a full-time qualification. After completion of the BA UnivPrep programme, successful participants wishing to enrol for the BA **Degree** in Public Governance (with Policing Practice) can only enrol for the degree by means of distance education.

Minimum Admission Requirements

- National Senior Certificate with university admission to Diploma- or Bachelor's degree study, or equivalent qualification.
- Admission Points Score (APS) of 5 points below normal admission (APS score of 25) to BA- studies, otherwise
 admission per Senate Discretionary rule. This implies that a minimum APS score of 20 will be considered for
 admission to the UnivPrep BA Public Governance (with Policing Practice) programme.
- Specific Requirements
 - Basic Computer Literacy
 - Personal access to Internet by means of a computer or laptop
 - It is **COMPULSORY**, and the responsibility of the student to obtain the necessary technology such as a computer and mobile phone that meet the minimum specifications of the NWU namely: Wi-Fi enabled, Windows-, Android- or Apple operating system, 3G enabled (preferably) and 32 Gig (preferably).

14.5 UnivPrep Specialisation: Grade R Diploma in Teaching

PLEASE NOTE:

- After successful completion of the UnivPrep Grade R programme, prospective students wishing to enrol for the formal Grade R Diploma in Teaching, will be expected to provide evidence that he/she is appointed at a school as a Grade R practitioner or teaching assistant in a Grade-R class in order to be considered for admission to formal Grade R Diploma study.
- The formal Grade R Diploma in Teaching is being offered by the NWU by means of distance education only.

Minimum Admission Requirements

- National Senior Certificate with admission to Higher Certificate study, or equivalent qualification OR
- Senior Certificate passed with an achievement of 40% in three subjects of which one must be a recognized subject on the Higher Grade
- Specific Requirements
 - Basic Computer Literacy
 - Personal access to Internet by means of a computer or laptop
 - It is **COMPULSORY**, and the responsibility of the student to obtain the necessary technology such as a computer and mobile phone that meet the minimum specifications of the NWU namely: Wi-Fi enabled, Windows-, Android- or Apple operating system, 3G enabled (preferably) and 32 Gig (preferably).

Note: To be considered for admission to the UnivPrep Grade R programme, applicants do not have to be appointed at a school as a Grade R practitioner or teaching assistant in a Grade-R class.

14.6 <u>UnivPrep Specialisation: Bachelor of Education – Foundation Phase</u>

It is in the best interest of all applicants to take note of the programme-specific requirements for admission in order to submit an application that meets all conditions and requirements.

Minimum Admission Requirements

- National Senior Certificate with university admission to Diploma- or Bachelor's degree study, or equivalent qualification.
- Admission Points Score (APS) of 2 points below normal admission (APS score of 24) to BEd studies, otherwise
 admission per Senate Discretionary rule. This implies that a minimum APS score of 22 will be considered for
 admission to the BEd UnivPrep programme.
- Language Requirements

IMPORTANT TO NOTE:

After successful completion of the UnivPrep BEd Foundation Phase programme, UnivPrep participants may apply for admission to the different phases of the BEd DEGREE programme. However, UnivPrep applicants should take note of the following specific language admission requirements to be met in order to qualify for admission to the various phases of the BEd Degree:

- o For admission to the BEd Foundation Phase Degree
 - Home Language is compulsory over the four years of degree study and due to lecturing capacity, only prospective students with Southern-Sotho, Setswana, Sepedi, IsiZulu, English or Afrikaans Home Language at Grade 12 level, with a minimum pass mark of 50%, will be considered for admission to the BEd Foundation Phase Degree programme.
- o For admission to the BEd Intermediate Phase Degree
 - Currently, the BEd Intermediate Phase Degree is only available for the curricula in Social Sciences and Life Skills for distance learning. Home Language is compulsory over the four years of degree study and due to lecturing capacity, only prospective students with Southern-Sotho, Setswana, Sepedi, IsiZulu, or Afrikaans Home Language at Grade 12 level, with a minimum pass mark of 50%, will be considered for admission to the BEd Intermediate Phase Degree programme.
- o For admission to the BEd Senior and Further Education and Training Phase Degree
 Prospective students who want to select a language as a major subject, must pass that particular language at
 Grade 12 Home Language level with a minimum pass mark of 50%. Prospective students who want to select
 English as a major, must pass English at Grade 12 Home Language level with a minimum pass mark of 50% OR
 at First Additional Language level with a minimum pass mark of 60%. Languages which are available for
 selection by prospective students in the Senior and Further Education and Training Phase are: Setswana,
 Sepedi, IsiZulu, English, and Afrikaans.
- Specific Admission Requirements
 - Basic Computer Literacy
 - Personal access to Internet by means of a computer or laptop
 - It is **COMPULSORY**, and the responsibility of the student to obtain the necessary technology such as a computer and mobile phone that meet the minimum specifications of the NWU namely: Wi-Fi enabled, Windows-, Android- or Apple operating system, 3G enabled (preferably) and 32 Gig (preferably).
